We are pleased that you have chosen the Children's Zoo at Celebration Square to visit your classroom. You have Chosen the outreach program "What's for Dinner?". This program is about 45 minutes and geared for 4th graders. "What's for Dinner?" will talk mainly about the food webs and food cycles. The program will include props and Biofacts like skulls, feathers and skins. Your class will also be visited by 3 live education animals. As the teacher you will receive a teacher information packet that includes 3 post visit activities (Memory, Explore and Extend).
